What is a Vaccine?

• A vaccine is medicine.

 When you get this medicine, you are vaccinated.





What do Vaccines do?

- Vaccines help your body to prevent disease.
- The vaccine helps your body to make antibodies that fight diseases.
- Babies get vaccines to help them fight diseases. You may have been vaccinated when you were a baby.






Is there a vaccine for Covid-19?

 Yes. The COVID-19 vaccine will help protect you from COVID-19 by making antibodies.

 Antibodies will help your body fight COVID-19. This is called immunity.





What is the Covid -19 Vaccine called?

- You might hear different names for the Covid 19 vaccine.
- The vaccines have different names because different companies made them.
- Some common names are Pfizer BioNTech, Moderna or Johnson and Johnson





How will I get the vaccine?

• The COVID-19 vaccine is given as an injection.

The injection is given in your upper arm.

• A doctor, nurse or pharmacist will give you the vaccine.





Do I have to get the vaccine?

- The vaccine is free and will be available to every adult in Ireland.
- You have a choice whether to have the vaccine or not.
- It is important to remember that the vaccine will help to protect you from the effects of Covid-19.
