



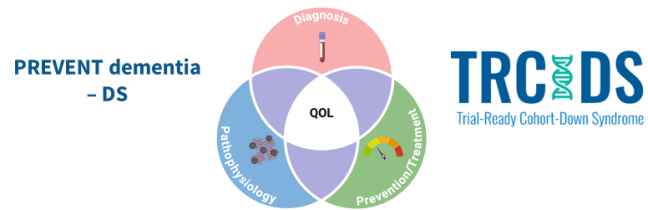


Information for people with Down syndrome about brain health and research.
